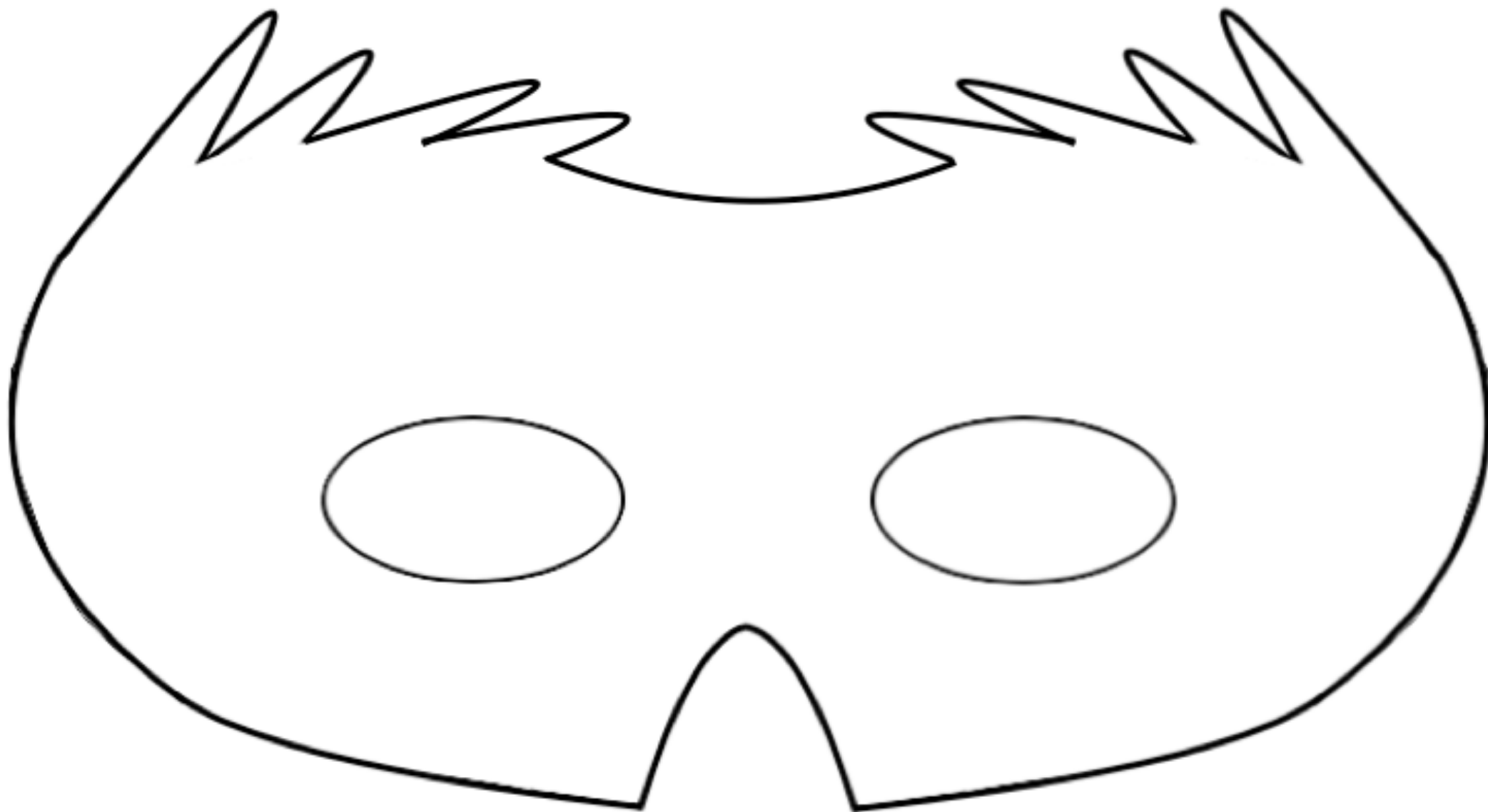
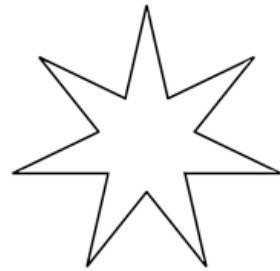
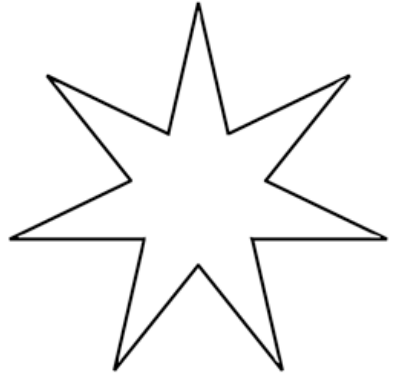
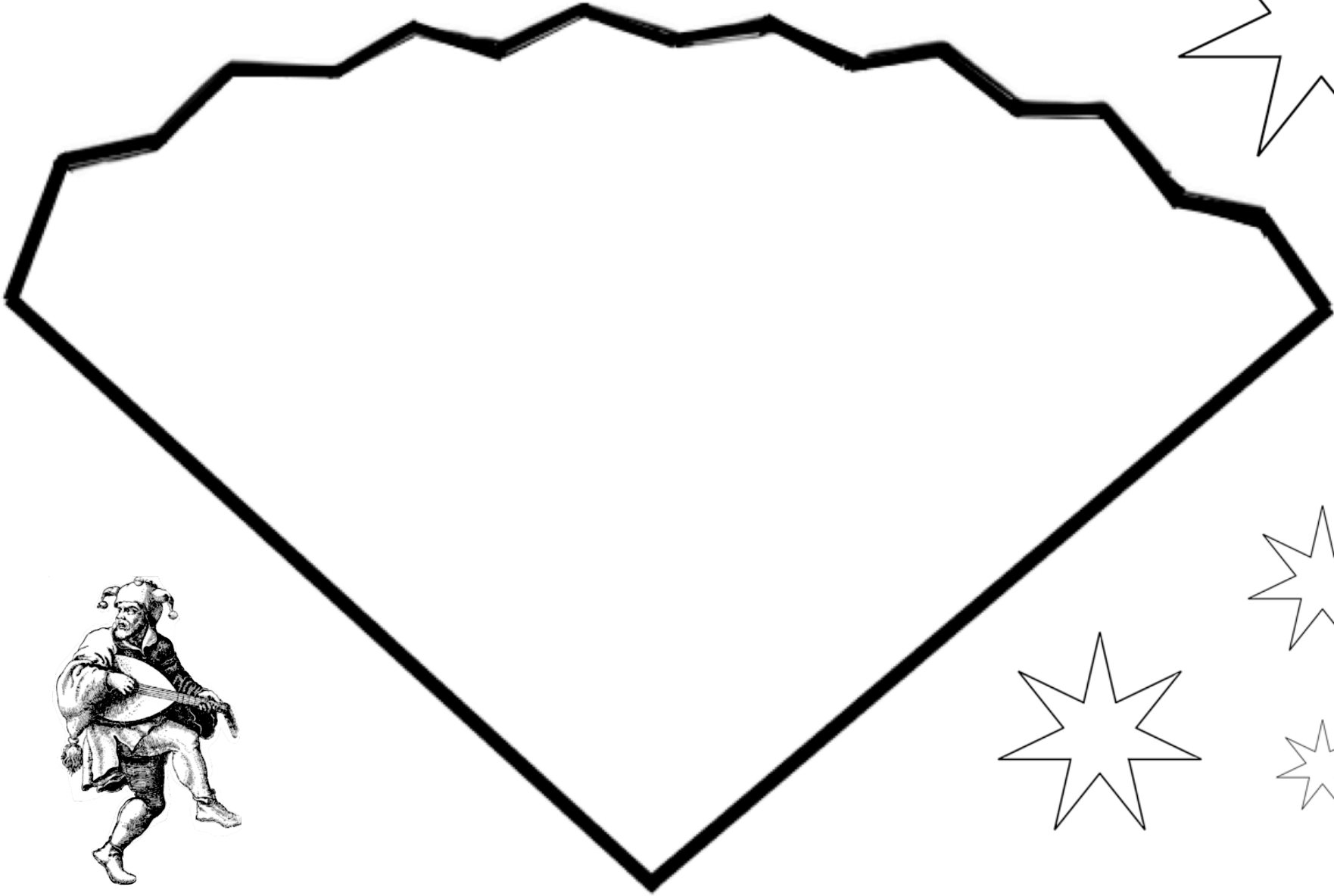


MASK/COSTUME GUIDE FOR THE VIRTUE OF TRUTH, WHOSE EMBLEM IS A FAN OF STARS (WITH WHICH SHE CHASES AWAY ERROR)...





INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAKING YOUR COSTUME:

- 1) Print out this pdf (landscape) on a standard piece of A4 paper and cut out the mask, fan, the four different-sized stars, and the tiny figure of Error.
- 2) Set aside the stars and Error for a moment, and use the mask and fan cut-outs as templates, to trace and cut out both shapes on different coloured card (your choice of colours!)
- 3) Stick the card fan on to the centre of the card mask, so the angled point sits downwards, centrally, just between the mask eyeholes.
- 4) Use the four stars as templates to cut out stars of different sizes on coloured card (silver or gold is traditional, but you can use any colour you like).
- 5) Cut out another four sets of the largest star, as well as another four sets of the two smallest stars.
- 6) Stick the stars onto the fan — you can use any pattern you like, but a suggested configuration is illustrated below (Fig.1).
- 7) Use a hole-punch to make holes on either side of the mask and then thread a piece of elastic through them and knot at both sides, so you can wear the mask comfortably on your head.

8) Stick the tiny paper figure of Error on one side of the mask, between the eyeholes and the elastic holes (see Fig. 2).

9) You can make your Virtue even more theatrical by sticking/stapling coloured ribbons to the back of your mask, to create 'hair' for yourself. Or add extra stars, feathers, tinsel... whatever you want to customise your Virtue!

10) Finish off your costume by wrapping up warm in comfy, waterproof clothes, then tying a white bedsheet over one shoulder – for that classical toga look!

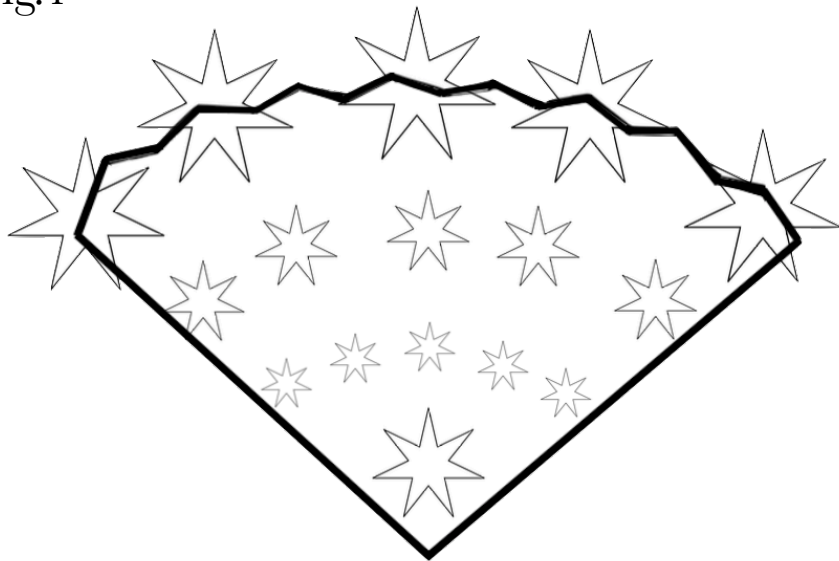
